

Pale lichen green is a rare colour in lighting yet it seems fitting for this intriguing design, which varies wildly in shape from organic and lyrical to geometric and formal. Also offered in white, it is made from aluminium tubing, with either copper or brass inner shades depending on the overall colour chosen, and sprawls across the wall or ceiling in four configurations. Distributed by Danish brand &Tradition from 2015 to 2018, the rights have reverted to Dutch designers Tineke Beunders and Nathan Wierink and the light is now manufactured and distributed in Eindhoven by their new company, Aptum. Custom colours are also possible.
